

FIRE SAFETY ADVICE

TEMPORARY CAR PARKS

When setting up a temporary car park, it is important to provide and maintain access at all times.

Consideration must be given to the following issues:

- Undertake a risk assessment to identify potential risks and ensure appropriate control measures are in place.
- Emergency Services will need to be able to access all areas of the car park if there is an accident or a fire.
- What action will you take if a vehicle becomes bogged down or breaks down.
 How will it be removed?
- Ensure that there is safe access in and out of the site for vehicles and people.
 Ideally they should use different access points and routes.
- Supply firefighting equipment, such as fire extinguishers, in suitable locations and make sure that staff are trained to use the equipment.

exits should be clearly signed and visible.

- Ensure grass is cut to a short length to avoid hot vehicle exhausts starting fires.
- Provide rubbish bins at the car park site and dispose of rubbish regularly.
- If the car park is being used during hours of darkness, ensure adequate lighting is provided.
